“ My first memories of this Mom and Mema was when "Polly", her husband Joe and their children lived around the corner south of the Church of Christ and my grandparents, the Millers, on SE "A" Street in Stigler! She had her first "Beauty Shop" built onto the North side of their house. She cut hair for many of the neighbors including my Mom, when we were in town. I especially remember her cutting my cousin Barbara's hair. She knew my cousin had been orphaned and lived with our shared grandparent since she was a baby of 18 months. Polly encouraged sweet Barbara and having a mother's heart was extra kind to her! I also remember well, Polly, making her famous biscuits, Christmas cakes, and good home cooking! I remember, someone, maybe John being the eldest boy, finding orphaned squirrels which she proceeded to bottle feed them milk since the mother wasn't around! I also remember Lavella (Around 5 years and me at 4) found some wands which come with the bubble blowing sets! Since Lavella knew where her Mom kept her "Joy" dish soap, we helped ourselves!
